4. A similarity between like features of two things.
5. Narration that uses the pronoun "you."
6. A conversation between two or more characters.
7. The readers find out about characters through thoughts, comments, or actions of the characters.
8. A character who undergoes an important change.
9. A group of lines in a poem that look like a paragraph.
10. A character who remains basically unchanged.
11. An expression, word, or phrase that has a figurative meaning understood by native speakers.
12. Stated clearly and in detail.
13. The narrator or characters in the story tell readers exactly what is needed to know about the characters.
14. The narrator is a person in the story telling the story from their own point of view. The narration usually utilizes the pronoun "I."
