1.	narrator	A person telling a story.
2.	first person	The narrator is a person in the story telling the story from their own point of view. The narration usually utilizes the pronoun "I."
3.	second person	Uses the pronoun "you" to address the reader.
4.	third person	The narrator exists outside the events of the story, and relates the actions of the characters by referring to their names or by the third-person pronouns "he", "she", or "they."
5.	stanza	A group of lines in a poem that look like a paragraph.
6.	static character	A character who remains basically unchanged.
7.	dynamic character	A character who undergoes an important change.
8.	explicit	Stated clearly and in detail.
9.	direct characterization	The narrator or a character in the story tells the readers exactly what is needed to know about the characters.
10.	indirect characterization	The readers find out about characters through thoughts, comments, or actions of the characters.
11.	fable	A brief story in prose or verse that teaches a moral or gives a practical lesson about how to live one's life.
12.	dialogue	A conversation between two or more characters.
13.	connotation	The feelings and associations that a word suggests.
14.	denotation	The literal dictionary definition of a word.
15.	allusion	A reference to a statement, a person, a place, or an event from literature, history, religion, mythology, politics, sports, or science.
