- Collecting information about a certain group of people.
- Fixed percentage of the principal.
- Requires that two inverse operations be performed in order to isolate the variable.
- When two numbers are added/multiplied together, the sum/product is the same regardless of the order.
- Representations of real objects or places that are in proportion to the objects or places they represent.
- Sum of their angles is equal to 180° .
- A characteristic used to describe the sample.
- States that the sum of the measures of the interior angles of a triangle is 180° .
- Ratio of side lengths in an enlargement to those of the original figure.
- Terms in an expression may be expanded in a particular way to form an equivalent expression.
- Angle whose measure is equal to 180° .
- States that the sum of the lengths of any two sides of a triangle is greater than the length of the third side.
- Event consisting of one outcome.
- Amount the dependent value changes for every unit the independent value changes.
- Two nonadjacent congruent angles that are formed by two intersecting lines.
