2.	foreshadowing	The use of clues to suggest events that will happen later in the plot.
3.	free verse	Poetry without a regular meter or rhyme scheme.
4.	imagery	Language that appeals to the senses.
5.	irony	In general, a contrast between expectation and reality.
6.	main idea	The most important idea expressed in a paragraph or in an essay.
7.	metamorphosis	A marvelous change from one shape or form to another.
8.	metaphor	An imaginative comparison between two unlike things in which one thing is said to be another thing.
9.	mood	The overall emotion created by a work of literature.
10.	myth	A story that explains something about the world and typically involves Gods or other superhuman beings.
11.	nonfiction	Prose writing that deals with real people, events, and places without changing any facts.
12.	novel	A fictional story that is usually more than one hundred book pages long.
13.	onomatopoeia	The use of words whose sounds echo their sense.
14.	personification	A figure of speech in which a nonhuman or nonliving thing or quality is talked about as if it were human or alive.
15.	plot	The series of related events that make up a story including the introduction, exposition, conflict, complications, climax, and resolution.
