- The decisive moment or turning point when the rising action of the play is reversed to falling action.
- The mood implied by an author's word choices.
- The background information of the characters and setting explained at the beginning of the story.
- The elements of plot after a story's climax and before the resolution.
- The message or underlying meaning a writer reveals in a novel, short story, or other literary work.
- The vantage point from which a story is presented.
