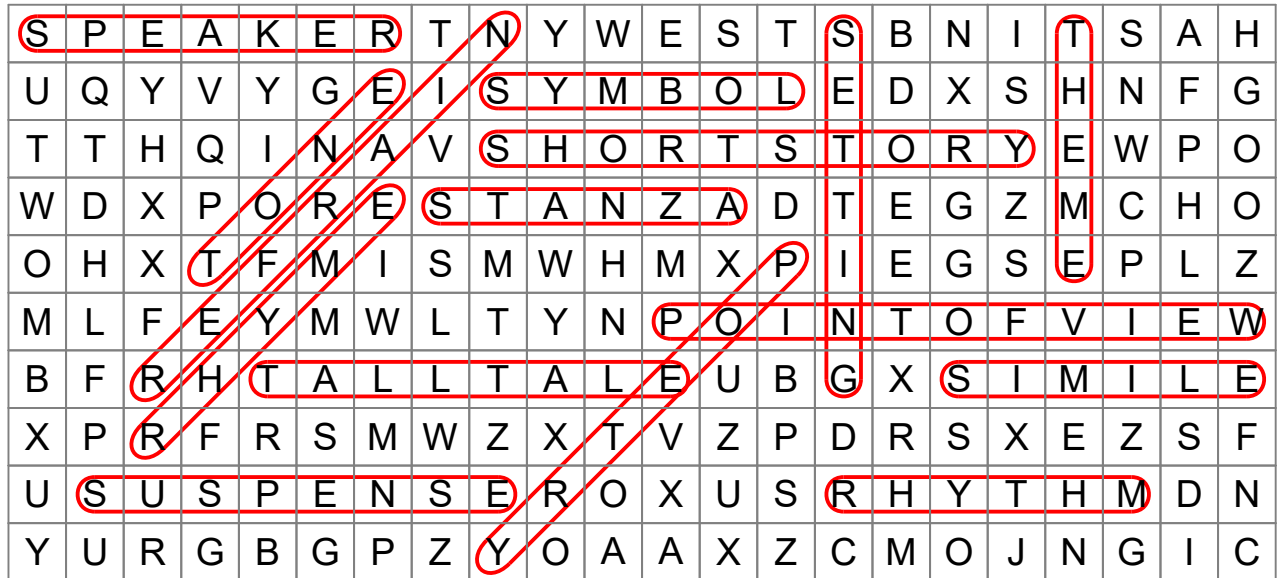

- The attitude that a writer takes toward the audience, a subject, or a character.
- A group of words repeated at intervals in a poem, song, or speech.
- The repetition of accented vowel sounds and all sounds following them in words close together in a poem.
- The voice talking in a poem.
- A fictional prose narrative that is usually ten to twenty pages long.
- The vantage point from which a story is told.
- The truth about life or main message revealed in a work of literature.
- The time and place in which the events of a work of literature take place.
- The uncertainty or anxiety you feel about what will happen next in a story.
- A person, a place, a thing, or an event that has its own meaning and stands for something beyond itself.
- A kind of rhythmic compressed language that uses figures of speech and imagery designed to appeal to emotion and imagination.
- A group of consecutive lines that form a single unit in a poem.
- An exaggerated fanciful story that gets more and more far-fetched as it is told and retold.
- A musical quality produced by the repetition of stressed and unstressed syllables or by the repetition of certain other sound patterns.
- A comparison between two unlike things using the words "like" or "as."
