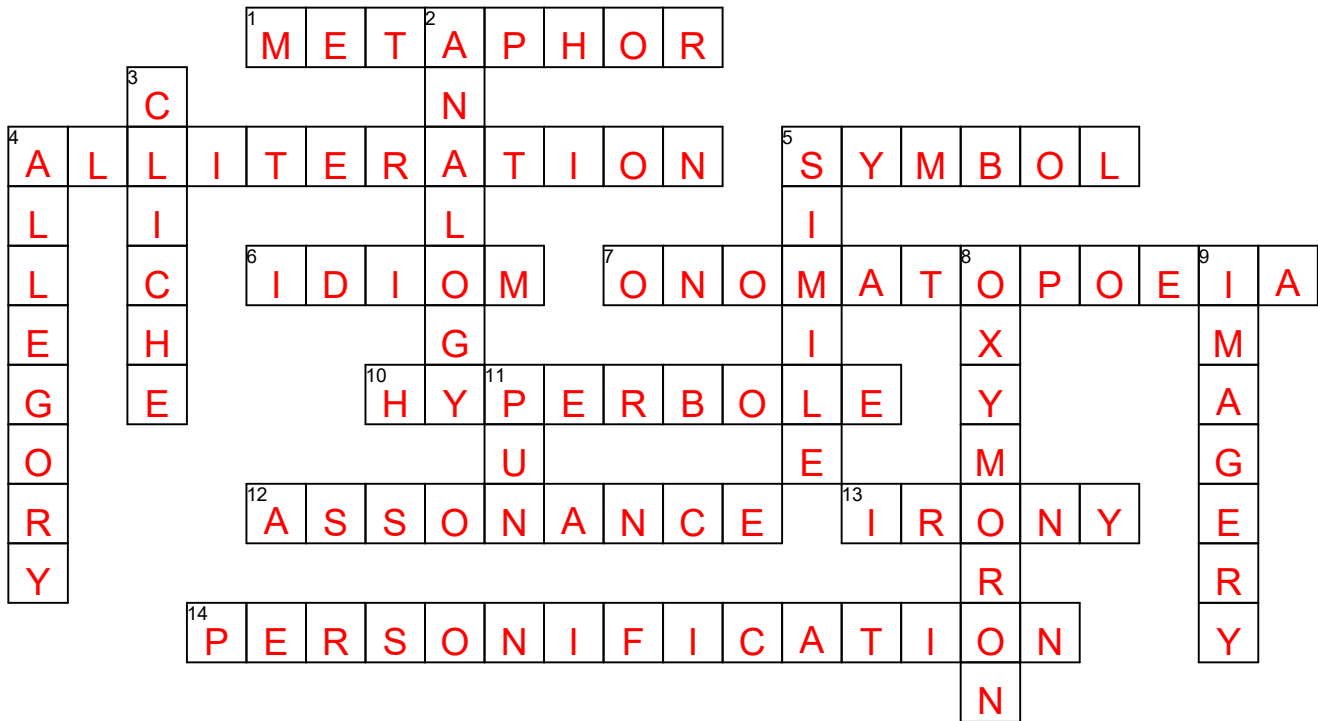


Figurative Language Crossword Puzzle 3
