1.	arid	Exhausted of moisture; parched with heat; dry; barren.
2.	butte	A detached low mountain, or high hill, rising abruptly from the general level of the surrounding plain; applied to peculiar elevations in the Rocky Mountain region.
3.	cactus	Any spiny succulent plant of the family Cactaceae native chiefly to arid regions of the New World.
4.	camel	Cud-chewing mammal used as a draft or saddle animal in desert regions.
5.	dunes	A ridge of sand created by the wind; found in deserts or near lakes and oceans.
6.	drought	A long period with little or no rain.
7.	deposition	Process by which sand is dropped by the wind to form hills or ridges.
8.	evaporation	In a desert, this process occurs faster than precipitation.
9.	Gobi	Desert located in Mongolia and China.
10.	gully	A channel or hollow worn in the earth by a current of water; a short deep portion of a torrent's bed when dry.
11.	Irrigation	Supplying dry land with water by means of ditches etc.
12.	Kalahari	Desert located in southern Africa.
13.	mesa	A high tableland; a plateau on a hill.
14.	Nile	This African river has been described as a "fountain of life" in a desert region.
15.	nocturnal	Having a habit of seeking food or moving about at night; as, nocturnal birds and insects.
16.	oasis	A fertile or green spot in a waste or desert, especially in a sandy desert.
17.	precipitation	A deposit on the earth of hail, mist, rain, sleet, or snow; also, the quantity of water deposited.
18.	rain shadow	Some deserts occur in the of mountains which block moist winds.
19.	Sahara	The world's largest desert.
20.	sand	Formed as a result of the rapid heating and cooling of rock in a desert.
21.	transpiration	Desert plants often reduce their rates of to conserve water.
22.	tropics	Most of the world's hot deserts are located here.
23.	wind	A major agent in the transportation and deposition of sand in the desert.
24.	sand storm	A windstorm that lifts up clouds of dust or sand.
25.	erosion	Condition in which rock surfaces are worn away by the action of wind.
