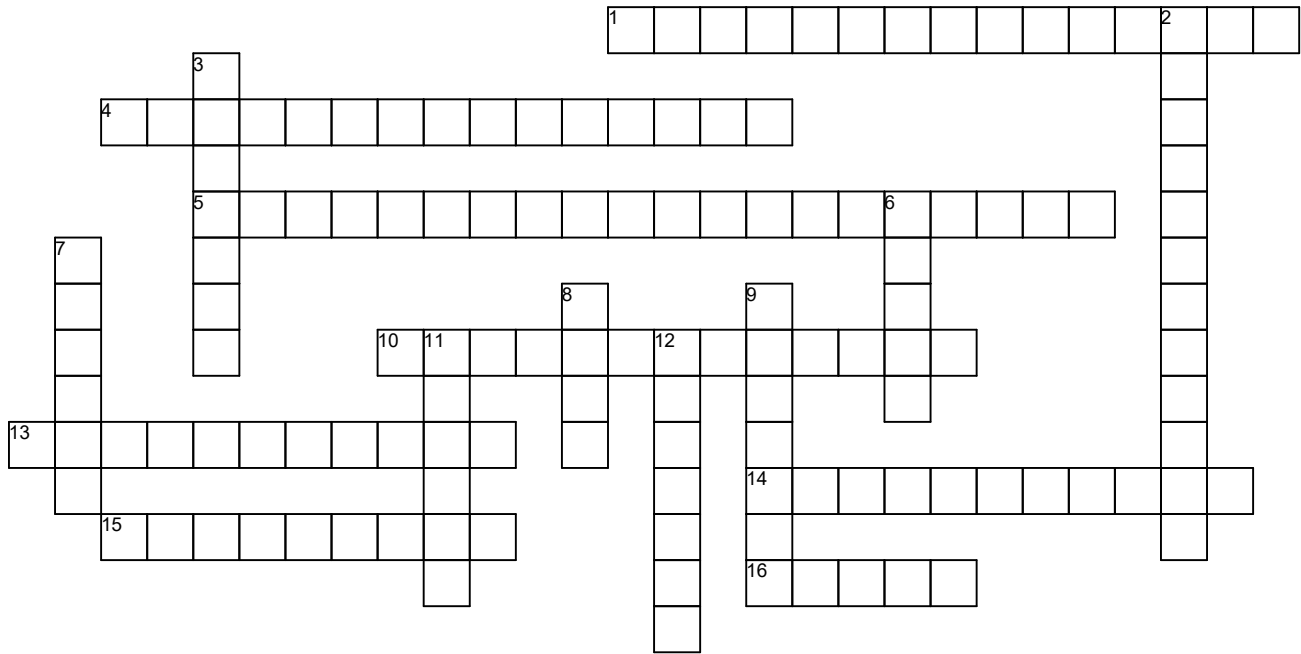


Labor Day Crossword Puzzle
