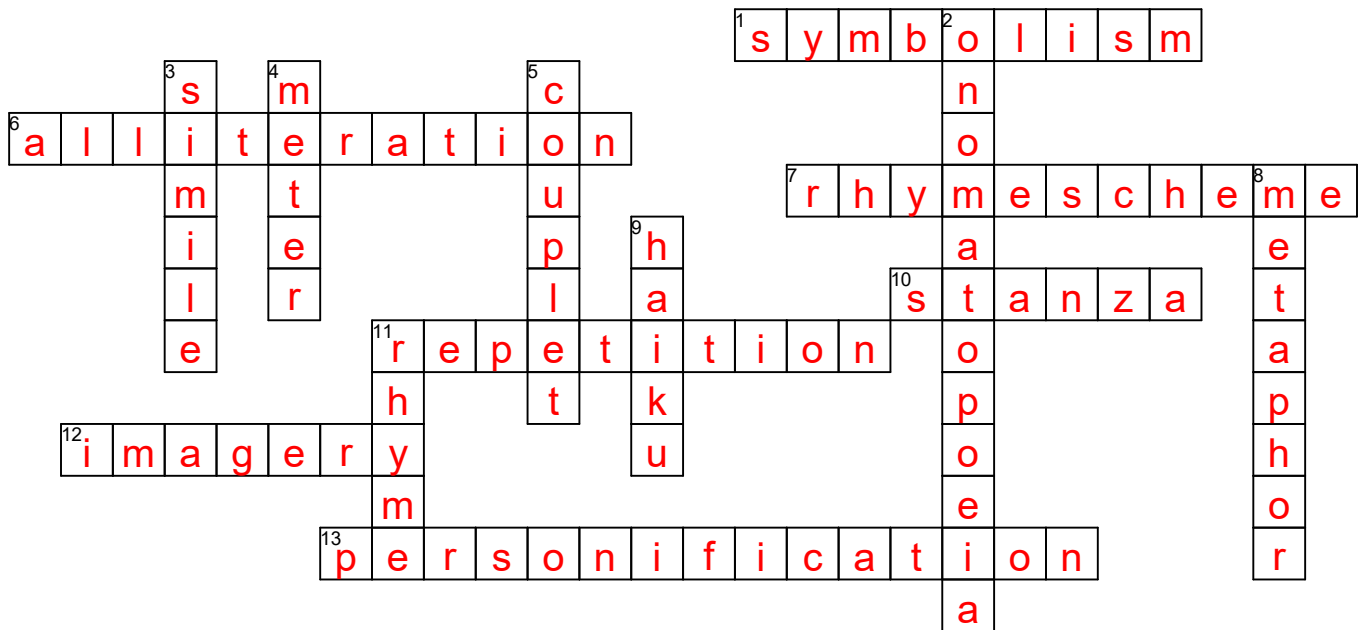


4th Grade Poetry Terms Crossword Puzzle 4

ACROSS

- Using objects or words to represent deeper meanings or ideas in a poem.
- The repetition of initial consonant sounds in a line of poetry.
- The pattern of rhyming words at the end of lines in a poem.
- A group of lines in a poem.
- The use of the same word or phrase multiple times in a poem for emphasis.
- Words or phrases that create vivid sensory experiences in poetry.
- Giving human qualities to non-human objects or animals.

DOWN

- Words that imitate the sound they represent (e.g., buzz, boom).
- A figure of speech that compares two things using "like" or "as."
- A regular pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
- Two consecutive lines of poetry that rhyme and often have the same meter.
- A figure of speech that compares two things without using "like" or "as."
- A short poem with three lines and a 5-7-5 syllable pattern.
- Words that have the same ending sound.
