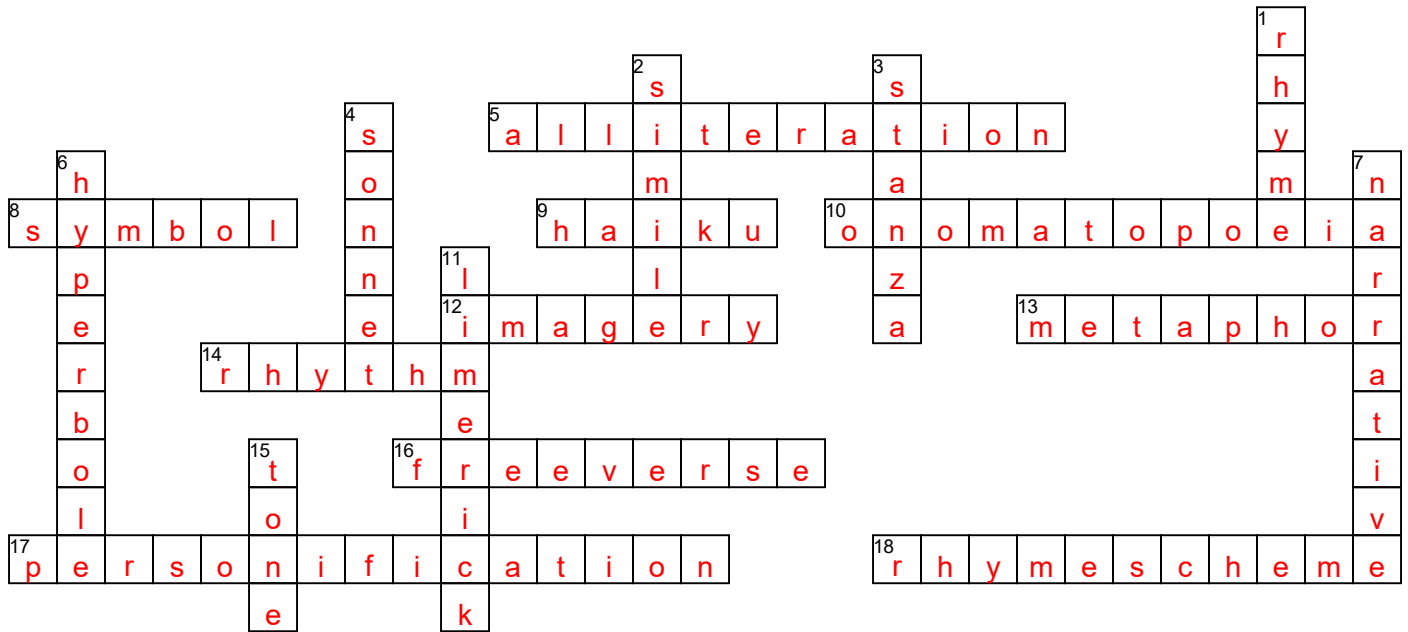


# 6th Grade Poetry Terms Crossword Puzzle 1
