
7th Grade Poetry Terms Crossword Puzzle 1

ACROSS

- 9. Poetry that lacks a regular rhyme or meter, often focusing on natural speech rhythms.
- 13. A poem that tells a story and has a plot, characters, and setting.
- 14. A humorous five-line poem with a specific rhyme and meter pattern.
- 16. A figure of speech that compares two unlike things using "like" or "as."
- 18. Words that imitate or resemble the sound they describe.
- 19. The repetition of vowel sounds within a line of poetry for auditory effect.
- 20. Giving human characteristics to non-human objects or animals.

- 2. A traditional Japanese poem with three lines and a 5-7-5 syllable pattern.
- 3. An object, person, or concept that represents a deeper meaning in a poem.
- 5. The central message or lesson conveyed by a poem.
- 6. A figure of speech that combines two contradictory words for a unique effect, like "bittersweet."
- 8. Exaggerated language or statements used for emphasis or effect.
- The similarity of sounds at the end of two or more words, often used for musical or rhythmic effect.
- A 14-line poem with a specific rhyme scheme and meter, often used for expressing love.
- 12. A group of lines in a poem that form a unit, often with a specific rhyme scheme or meter.
- 15. Vivid and descriptive language that appeals to the senses, creating a mental picture.
- 17. The pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
