

- 6. The pattern of rhyming words at the end of lines in a poem, often represented with letters (e.g., ABAB).
- 7. A 14-line poem with a specific rhyme scheme and meter, often used for expressing love.
- 8. The pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
- 11. The repetition of vowel sounds within a line of poetry for auditory effect.
- 12. A figure of speech that directly compares two unlike things by stating one is the other.
