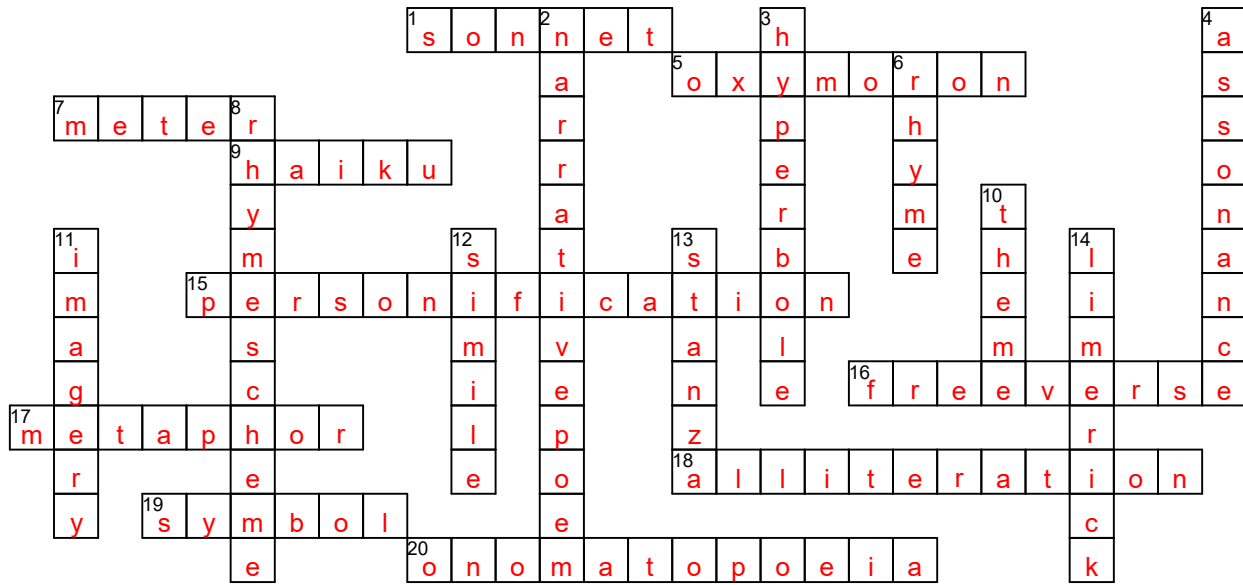


7th Grade Poetry Terms Crossword Puzzle 3

1. A 14-line poem with a specific rhyme scheme and meter, often used for expressing love.
5. A figure of speech that combines two contradictory words for a unique effect, like "bittersweet."
7. The pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
9. A traditional Japanese poem with three lines and a 5-7-5 syllable pattern.
15. Giving human characteristics to non-human objects or animals.
16. Poetry that lacks a regular rhyme or meter, often focusing on natural speech rhythms.
17. A figure of speech that directly compares two unlike things by stating one is the other.
18. The repetition of initial consonant sounds in a line or verse.
19. An object, person, or concept that represents a deeper meaning in a poem.
20. Words that imitate or resemble the sound they describe.

2. A poem that tells a story and has a plot, characters, and setting.
3. Exaggerated language or statements used for emphasis or effect.
4. The repetition of vowel sounds within a line of poetry for auditory effect.
6. The similarity of sounds at the end of two or more words, often used for musical or rhythmic effect.
8. The pattern of rhyming words at the end of lines in a poem, often represented with letters (e.g., ABAB).
10. The central message or lesson conveyed by a poem.
11. Vivid and descriptive language that appeals to the senses, creating a mental picture.
12. A figure of speech that compares two unlike things using "like" or "as."
13. A group of lines in a poem that form a unit, often with a specific rhyme scheme or meter.
14. A humorous five-line poem with a specific rhyme and meter pattern.
