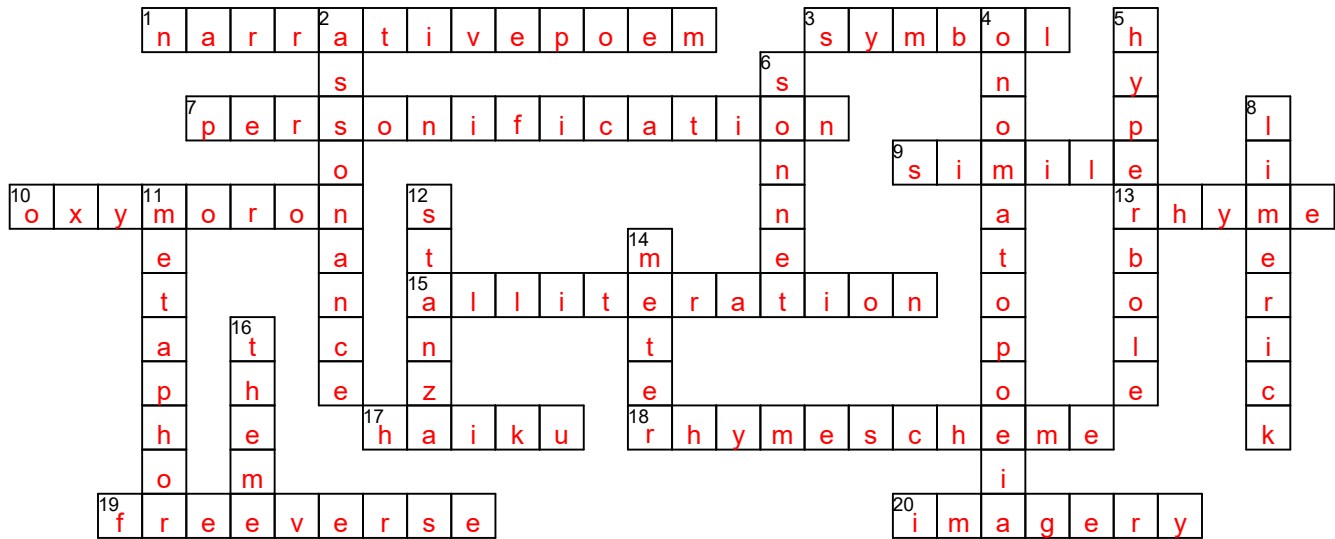


7th Grade Poetry Terms Crossword Puzzle 4

ACROSS

1. A poem that tells a story and has a plot, characters, and setting.
3. An object, person, or concept that represents a deeper meaning in a poem.
7. Giving human characteristics to non-human objects or animals.
9. A figure of speech that compares two unlike things using "like" or "as."
10. A figure of speech that combines two contradictory words for a unique effect, like "bittersweet."
13. The similarity of sounds at the end of two or more words, often used for musical or rhythmic effect.
15. The repetition of initial consonant sounds in a line or verse.
17. A traditional Japanese poem with three lines and a 5-7-5 syllable pattern.
18. The pattern of rhyming words at the end of lines in a poem, often represented with letters (e.g., ABAB).
19. Poetry that lacks a regular rhyme or meter, often focusing on natural speech rhythms.
20. Vivid and descriptive language that appeals to the senses, creating a mental picture.

2. The repetition of vowel sounds within a line of poetry for auditory effect.
4. Words that imitate or resemble the sound they describe.
5. Exaggerated language or statements used for emphasis or effect.
6. A 14-line poem with a specific rhyme scheme and meter, often used for expressing love.
8. A humorous five-line poem with a specific rhyme and meter pattern.
11. A figure of speech that directly compares two unlike things by stating one is the other.
12. A group of lines in a poem that form a unit, often with a specific rhyme scheme or meter.
14. The pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
16. The central message or lesson conveyed by a poem.
