1.	stanza	A group of lines in a poem that form a unit, often with a specific rhyme scheme or meter.
2.	rhyme	The similarity of sounds at the end of two or more words, often used for musical or rhythmic effect.
3.	metaphor	A figure of speech that directly compares two unlike things by stating one is the other.
4.	simile	A figure of speech that compares two unlike things using "like" or "as."
5.	imagery	Vivid and descriptive language that appeals to the senses, creating a mental picture.
6.	personification	Giving human characteristics to non-human objects or animals.
7.	alliteration	The repetition of initial consonant sounds in a line or verse.
8.	onomatopoeia	Words that imitate or resemble the sound they describe.
9.	meter	The pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
10.	haiku	A traditional Japanese poem with three lines and a 5-7-5 syllable pattern.
11.	rhyme scheme	The pattern of rhyming words at the end of lines in a poem, often represented with letters (e.g., ABAB).
12.	sonnet	A 14-line poem with a specific rhyme scheme and meter, often used for expressing love.
13.	hyperbole	Exaggerated language or statements used for emphasis or effect.
14.	symbol	An object, person, or concept that represents a deeper meaning in a poem.
15.	theme	The central message or lesson conveyed by a poem.
16.	narrative poem	A poem that tells a story and has a plot, characters, and setting.
17.	limerick	A humorous five-line poem with a specific rhyme and meter pattern.
18.	free verse	Poetry that lacks a regular rhyme or meter, often focusing on natural speech rhythms.
19.	oxymoron	A figure of speech that combines two contradictory words for a unique effect, like "bittersweet."
20.	assonance	The repetition of vowel sounds within a line of poetry for auditory effect.
