

- 11. The continuation of a sentence or phrase from one line of poetry to the next without a pause.
- 13. The central message or idea conveyed by a poem.
- 16. The rhythmic pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
- 18. The similarity of sounds at the end of words in poetry.
