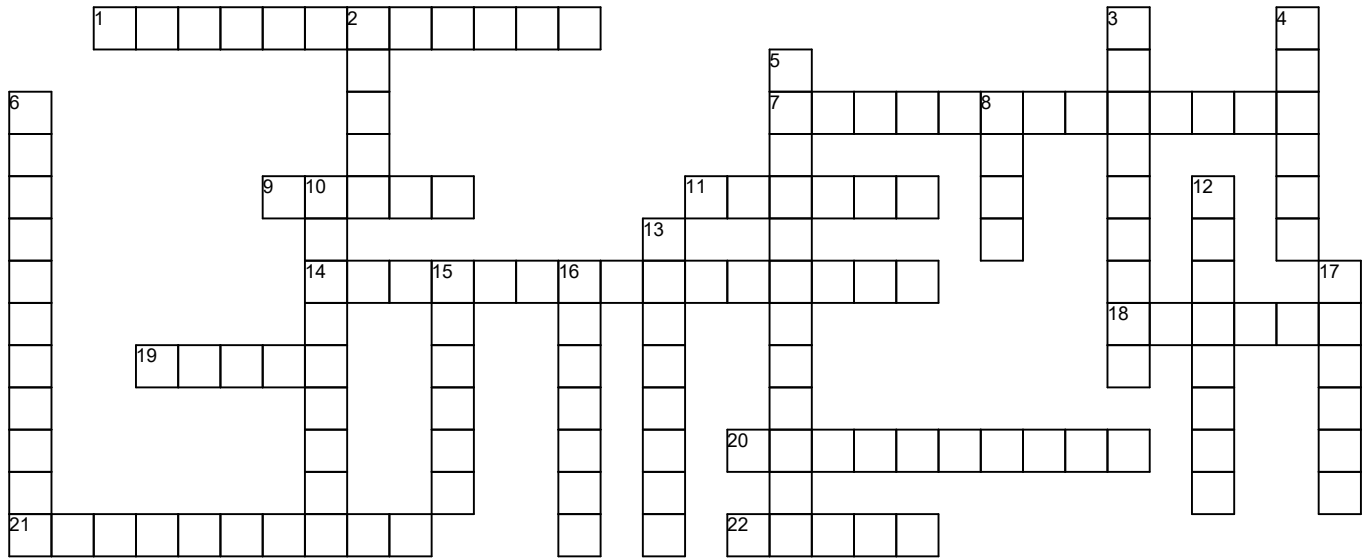


# 8th Grade Poetry Terms Crossword Puzzle 2

## ACROSS

1. The repetition of initial consonant sounds in a line of poetry.
7. A poem that tells a story or recounts events.
9. The central message or idea conveyed by a poem.
11. A figure of speech that compares two unlike things using "like" or "as."
14. Giving human qualities to non-human objects or animals.
18. A group of lines in a poem that forms a distinct unit.
19. The rhythmic pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
20. The use of words, phrases, or sounds for emphasis or effect.
21. The continuation of a sentence or phrase from one line of poetry to the next without a pause.
22. A three-line Japanese poem with 5 syllables in the first line, 7 in the second, and 5 in the third.

2. The similarity of sounds at the end of words in poetry.
3. Poetry that does not follow a specific rhyme or meter pattern.
4. An object or element in a poem that represents a deeper meaning or concept.
5. Words that imitate the sound they represent (e.g., "buzz" or "hiss").
6. The pattern of rhyming words in a poem, usually represented by letters (e.g., ABAB).
8. The author's attitude or emotional expression in a poem.
10. Exaggerated language used for emphasis or effect.
12. A figure of speech that compares two unlike things without using "like" or "as."
13. A humorous five-line poem with a specific rhyme scheme (AABBA).
15. A 14-line poem with a specific rhyme scheme and meter, often expressing love or beauty.
16. Descriptive language that creates vivid mental pictures for the reader.
17. A narrative poem that often tells a tragic story and is typically sung or recited.
