

- A 14-line poem with a specific rhyme scheme and meter, often expressing love or beauty.
- 7. The pattern of rhyming words in a poem, usually represented by letters (e.g., ABAB).
- 8. Poetry that does not follow a specific rhyme or meter pattern.
- The rhythmic pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
- 12. An object or element in a poem that represents a deeper meaning or concept.
- 16. A three-line Japanese poem with 5 syllables in the first line, 7 in the second, and 5 in the third.
