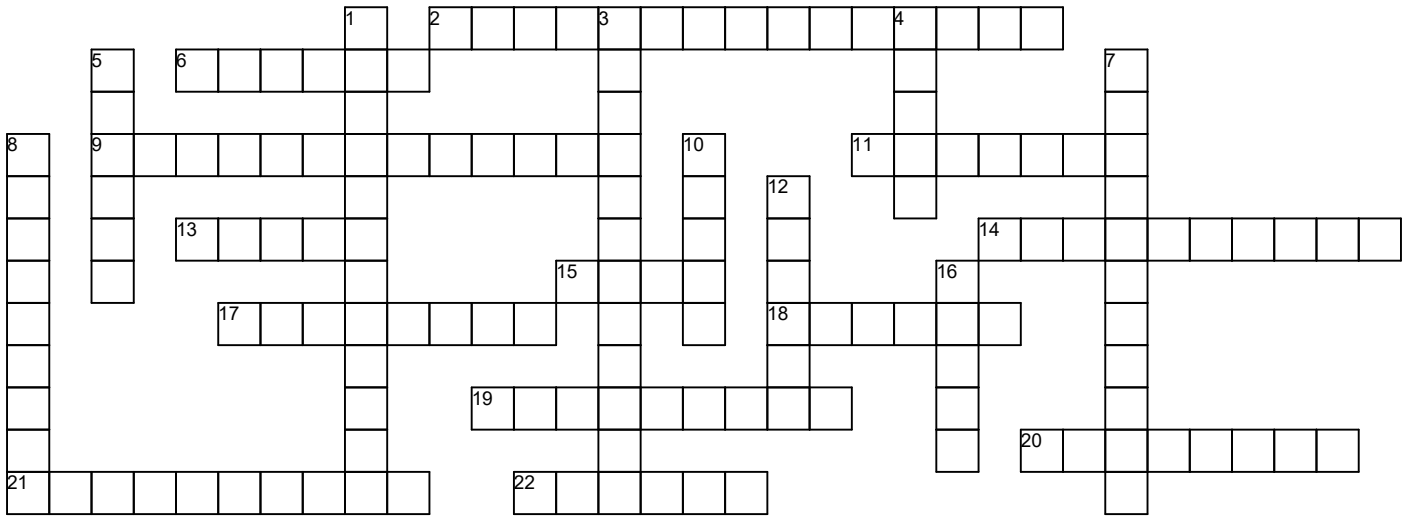


8th Grade Poetry Terms Crossword Puzzle 3

7. The pattern of rhyming words in a poem, usually represented by letters (e.g., ABAB).
8. Poetry that does not follow a specific rhyme or meter pattern.
10. The rhythmic pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
12. An object or element in a poem that represents a deeper meaning or concept.
16. A three-line Japanese poem with 5 syllables in the first line, 7 in the second, and 5 in the third.
