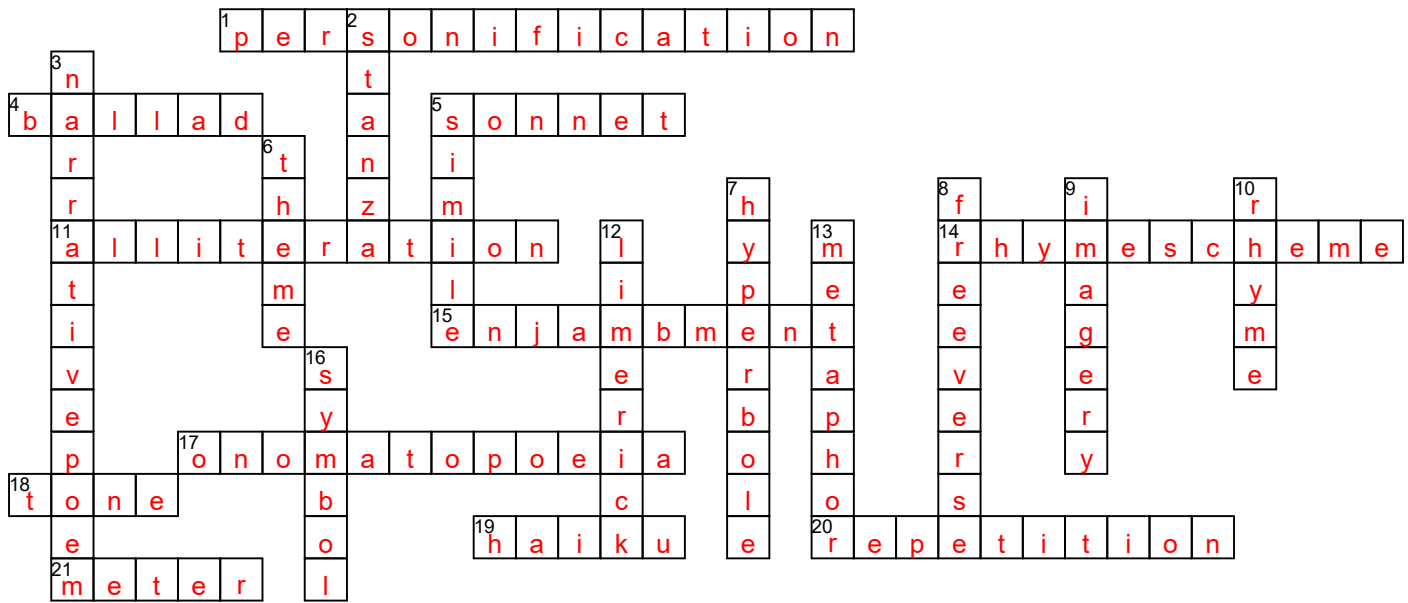


# 8th Grade Poetry Terms Crossword Puzzle 4

## ACROSS

1. Giving human qualities to non-human objects or animals.
4. A narrative poem that often tells a tragic story and is typically sung or recited.
5. A 14-line poem with a specific rhyme scheme and meter, often expressing love or beauty.
11. The repetition of initial consonant sounds in a line of poetry.
14. The pattern of rhyming words in a poem, usually represented by letters (e.g., ABAB).
15. The continuation of a sentence or phrase from one line of poetry to the next without a pause.
17. Words that imitate the sound they represent (e.g., "buzz" or "hiss").
18. The author's attitude or emotional expression in a poem.
19. A three-line Japanese poem with 5 syllables in the first line, 7 in the second, and 5 in the third.
20. The use of words, phrases, or sounds for emphasis or effect.
21. The rhythmic pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in a line of poetry.
