
African American Scientists Crossword Puzzle

- 8. First African American woman to earn a Ph.D. in chemistry in the U.S., known for research on cholesterol and hypertension.
- Biochemist who made significant contributions to NASA's space exploration efforts, particularly in life detection techniques.
- 12. Ophthalmologist and inventor of the Laserphaco Probe, used in cataract treatment, and the first African American woman to complete a residency in ophthalmology.
- 14. Computer scientist and engineer credited with significant contributions to the development of the IBM personal computer.
- 15. Inventor and engineer known for improving the pacemaker and developing electronic control devices.
- Groundbreaking surgeon who performed one of the first successful open-heart surgeries and founded Provident Hospital.
- 17. Computer scientist and mathematician who contributed to NASA's space programs.
- 18. Agricultural scientist recognized for his work on crop rotation and multiple uses of peanuts.
- 19. Aerospace engineer and inventor of the Super Soaker water gun.

- 1. Biologist whose research laid the groundwork for modern cell biology, particularly in fertilization and cell division.
- Zoologist and marine biologist, the first African American woman to earn a Ph.D. in zoology, focusing on the effects of radiation on sea urchin embryos.
- 3. Chemist renowned for synthesizing medicinal drugs from plants, contributing greatly to pharmaceuticals.
- 5. Astrophysicist known for popularizing science through books, television, and public appearances.
- 6. Astronomer, mathematician, and surveyor who helped survey the original boundaries of Washington, D.C.
- 7. Astrophysicist and inventor of the ultraviolet camera spectrograph used in the Apollo 16 mission.
- 8. Physician and engineer who became the first African American woman to travel in space as a NASA astronaut.
- 9. Surgical technician who developed techniques for treating cyanotic heart disease and helped pioneer open-heart surgery.
- Pioneering researcher in blood transfusions, credited with developing blood storage techniques and establishing the first blood banks.
