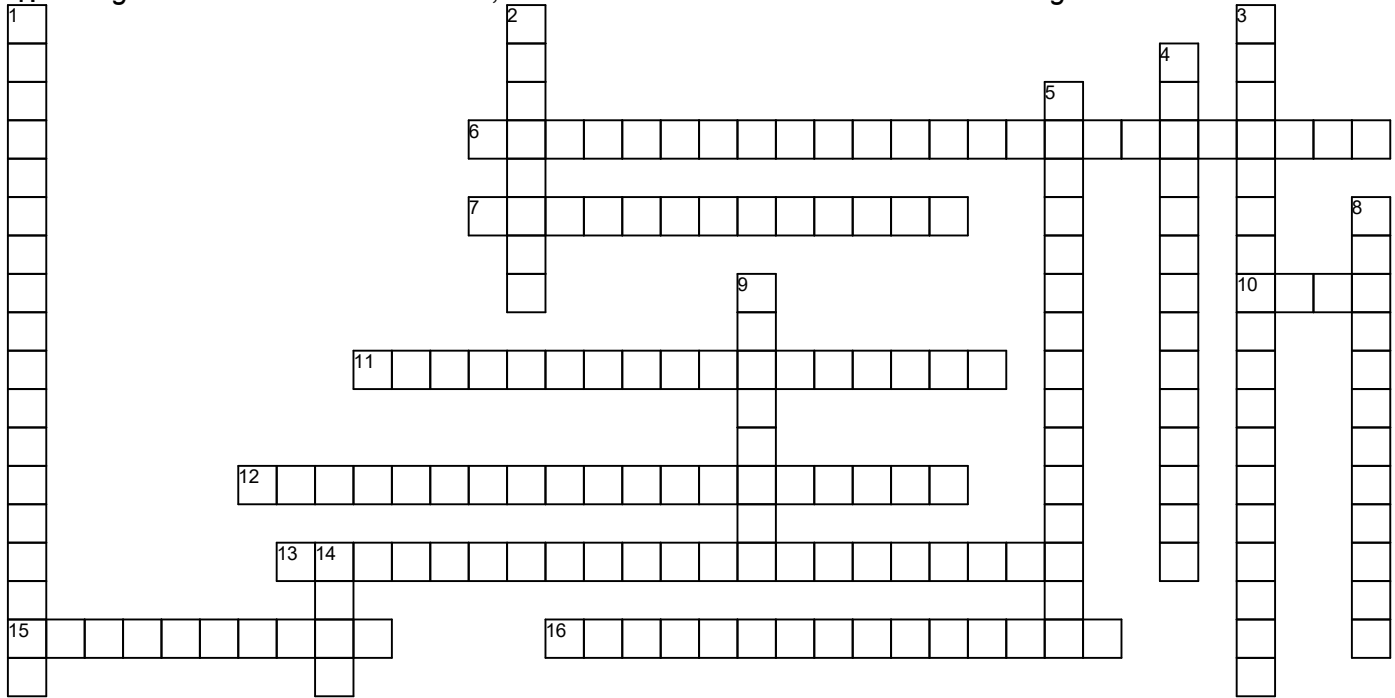


Jackie Robinson Crossword Puzzle
