2.	Brooklyn Dodgers	Robinson played his entire Major League Baseball career for this team from 1947 to 1956.
3.	Civil Rights Activist	Beyond his baseball career, Jackie Robinson was a prominent , fighting against racial discrimination.
4.	UCLA	Robinson attended this University where he became the first athlete to letter in four varsity sports: baseball, basketball, football, and track.
5.	Forty-Two	Jackie Robinson's jersey number was this number and it was retired by all Major League Baseball teams to honor his legacy.
6.	Hall of Fame	Robinson was inducted into the in 1962, his first year of eligibility.
7.	Pasadena	Jackie Robinson was born in Cairo, Georgia, but grew up in this California city.
8.	Most Valuable Player	In 1949, Robinson won the National League Award, becoming the first African American player to achieve this.
9.	Kansas City Monarchs	Before joining the Brooklyn Dodgers, Robinson played for the
10.	Medal of Freedom	In 1984, Jackie Robinson was posthumously awarded the Presidential , the highest civilian award in the United States.
11.	Branch Rickey	He was the executive of the Brooklyn Dodgers who signed Jackie Robinson, breaking baseball's color barrier.
12.	Pasadena Junior College	Before transferring to UCLA, Robinson attended, where he excelled in athletics.
13.	Second Baseman	Jackie Robinson primarily played this position for the Brooklyn Dodgers.
14.	Cincinnati Redlegs	After retiring from baseball, Robinson worked as an executive for the coffee company Chock full o'Nuts and later served as an executive for the
15.	Jackie Robinson Foundation	Established in 1973, this organization provides scholarships and leadership development opportunities for minority students.
16.	Army	During World War II, Robinson served in this branch of the US Military, although he faced racial discrimination while in the service.
