5.	Northwest Territory	Region where Harrison served as governor.
6.	Army	Harrison served in this branch of the military during the War of 1812.
7.	Indiana Territory	Area where Harrison served as governor before it became a state.
8.	John Tyler	Harrison's vice president who succeeded him after his death.
9.	The Old Tippecanoe	Nickname for Harrison.
10.	Fort Meigs	Strategic fortification built under Harrison's command during the War of 1812.
11.	Battle of Fallen Timbers	Conflict where Harrison fought against Native American tribes allied with the British.
12.	Congress	Harrison served in this legislative body before becoming president.
13.	Tippecanoe and Tyler Too	Campaign slogan for Harrison's presidential bid.
14.	White House	Harrison gave the longest inauguration speech in history here, catching pneumonia and dying 31 days later in this residence.
15.	Log Cabin Campaign	Strategy used by Harrison's campaign to portray him as a humble frontier hero.
16.	Battle of the Thames	Key victory for Harrison in the War of 1812, where Tecumseh was killed.
17.	William Henry Harrison	Full name of the ninth President of the United States.
18.	Vincennes	City in Indiana where Harrison served as the Territorial Delegate to Congress.
