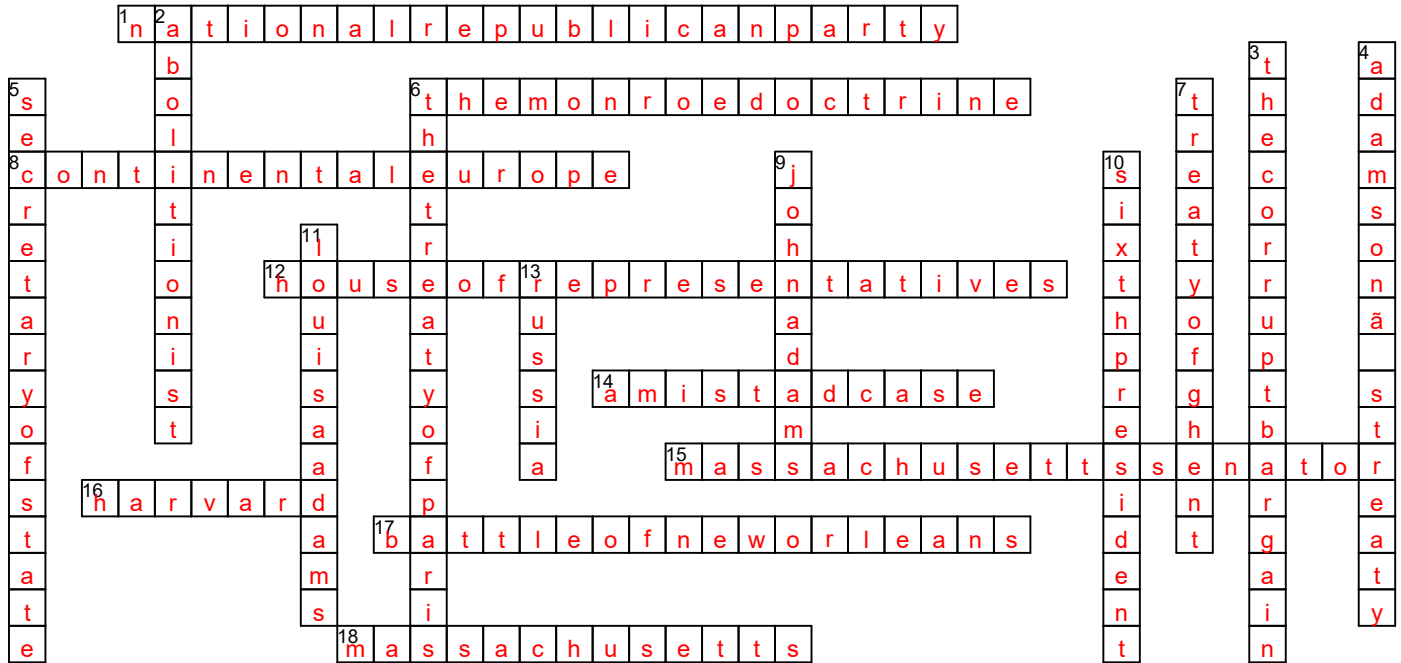


# President John Quincy Adams Crossword Puzzle

## ACROSS

- Political party that Adams was associated with during his presidency, which advocated for a strong federal government and internal improvements.
- Adams played a significant role in formulating this policy, which warned European powers against further colonization in the Americas.
- Adams traveled extensively in his youth, accompanying his father, John Adams, who was a diplomat in various countries across this region.
- After his presidency, Adams served in this governmental body, becoming an influential voice.
- Adams successfully argued before the Supreme Court on behalf of enslaved Africans who revolted and took control of the Spanish ship "Amistad," leading to their eventual freedom.
- Adams served in this role before becoming president, advocating for various policies and causes.
- The university where John Quincy Adams studied law.
- A major battle during the War of 1812, which occurred after the Treaty of Ghent was signed but before news of the treaty reached the United States.
- The state where John Quincy Adams was born on July 11, 1767.

## DOWN

- John Quincy Adams was a vocal opponent of slavery and a leading advocate for this movement.
- Term used by Andrew Jackson's supporters to describe the outcome of the 1824 presidential election, in which Adams was accused of making backroom deals to secure his victory.
- Agreement negotiated by Adams, which defined the border between the United States and Spanish Florida.
- Position held by Adams under President James Monroe, during which he negotiated several treaties.
- Adams was involved in negotiations for this treaty in 1783, which ended the American Revolutionary War and recognized the United States' independence from Great Britain.
- The agreement negotiated by Adams, which ended the War of 1812 between the United States and Britain.
- John Quincy Adams' father, who was the second president of the United States.
- John Quincy Adams was elected as the nation's \_\_\_\_\_ in 1824.
- The name of John Quincy Adams' wife, whom he married in 1797.
- Adams served as United States Ambassador to this country from 1809 to 1814.
