
President John Quincy Adams Crossword Puzzle

- 5. Position held by Adams under President James Monroe, during which he negotiated several treaties.
- Adams was involved in negotiations for this treaty in 1783, which ended the American Revolutionary War and recognized the United States' independence from Great Britain.
- 7. The agreement negotiated by Adams, which ended the War of 1812 between the United States and Britain.
- 9. John Quincy Adams' father, who was the second president of the United States.
- 10. John Quincy Adams was elected as the nation's _____ in 1824.
