1.	Massachusetts	The state where John Quincy Adams was born on July 11, 1767.
2.	Louisa Adams	The name of John Quincy Adams' wife, whom he married in 1797.
3.	Harvard	The university where John Quincy Adams studied law.
4.	Secretary of State	Position held by Adams under President James Monroe, during which he negotiated several treaties.
5.	Abolitionist	John Quincy Adams was a vocal opponent of slavery and a leading advocate for this movement.
6.	The Monroe Doctrine	Adams played a significant role in formulating this policy, which warned European powers against further colonization in the Americas.
7.	Russia	Adams served as United States Ambassador to this country from 1809 to 1814.
8.	Adams-OnÃs Treaty	Agreement negotiated by Adams, which defined the border between the United States and Spanish Florida.
9.	Sixth President	John Quincy Adams was elected as the nation's in 1824.
10.	House of Representatives	After his presidency, Adams served in this governmental body, becoming an influential voice.
11.	Treaty of Ghent	The agreement negotiated by Adams, which ended the War of 1812 between the United States and Britain.
12.	Continental Europe	Adams traveled extensively in his youth, accompanying his father, John Adams, who was a diplomat in various countries across this region.
13.	The Corrupt Bargain	Term used by Andrew Jackson's supporters to describe the outcome of the 1824 presidential election, in which Adams was accused of making backroom deals to secure his victory.
14.	Battle of New Orleans	A major battle during the War of 1812, which occurred after the Treaty of Ghent was signed but before news of the treaty reached the United States.
15.	Massachusetts Senator	Adams served in this role before becoming president, advocating for various policies and causes.
16.	The Treaty of Paris	Adams was involved in negotiations for this treaty in 1783, which ended the American Revolutionary War and recognized the United States' independence from Great Britain.
17.	National Republican Party	Political party that Adams was associated with during his presidency, which advocated for a strong federal government and internal improvements.
18.	John Adams	John Quincy Adams' father, who was the second president of the United States.
19.	Amistad case	Adams successfully argued before the Supreme Court on behalf of enslaved Africans who revolted and took control of the Spanish ship "Amistad," leading to their eventual freedom.
