
Famous Miltiary Women Crossword Puzzle

ACROSS

- First Secretary of the US Department of Health, Education, and Welfare and the first director of the Women's Army Corps, playing a key role in the integration of women into the US military.
- 5. Brigadier General in the US Army and one of the first two women to attain the rank of general officer.
- 8. Civil War surgeon and the only woman to receive the Medal of Honor for her service in the US military.
- Former slave who became a Union spy during the Civil War and led the Combahee River Raid, freeing over 700 slaves.
- 14. Actress and USO performer known as the "First Lady of the Big Broadcast" for her work entertaining troops during World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War.
- 15. US Marine Corps recruit and the first woman to graduate from the Marine Corps Infantry Training Battalion course.
- US Navy sailor and the first African-American recipient of the Navy Cross for his heroism during the attack on Pearl Harbor.
- 17. US Army nurse during World War II, awarded the Silver Star for her bravery and heroism during the Battle of Anzio.
- US Navy admiral and the first woman to become a four-star admiral, as well as the first African-American woman to achieve this rank.
- US Navy officer and the first Asian-American woman to join the US Navy, serving as a gunnery officer during World War II.

- 2. US Army veteran and Senator from Illinois, the first Thai-American woman elected to Congress and the first disabled woman to be elected to the Senate.
- 3. Revolutionary War soldier who fought alongside her husband and became the first woman to receive a pension from the US government for military service.
- 4. US Navy rear admiral and computer scientist, known for her pioneering work in computer programming languages such as COBOL.
- American who fought a legal battle to become the first female cadet to enroll at The Citadel, one of the United States military's five service academies, in 1995.
- 7. US Air Force Brigadier General and advocate for women in the military, instrumental in the establishment of the Women in Military Service for America Memorial.
- Actress and US Army Reserve member who was one of the first American celebrities to support troops during the Vietnam War, entertaining soldiers overseas.
- US Army officer and one of the first two women to graduate from the US Army Ranger School, breaking gender barriers in the military.
- US Air Force general and the first woman to lead a major Unified Combatant Command, the United States Northern Command.
- First female Puerto Rican soldier to die in combat and the first female member of the United States Armed Forces to die in a combat zone in the Iraq War.
