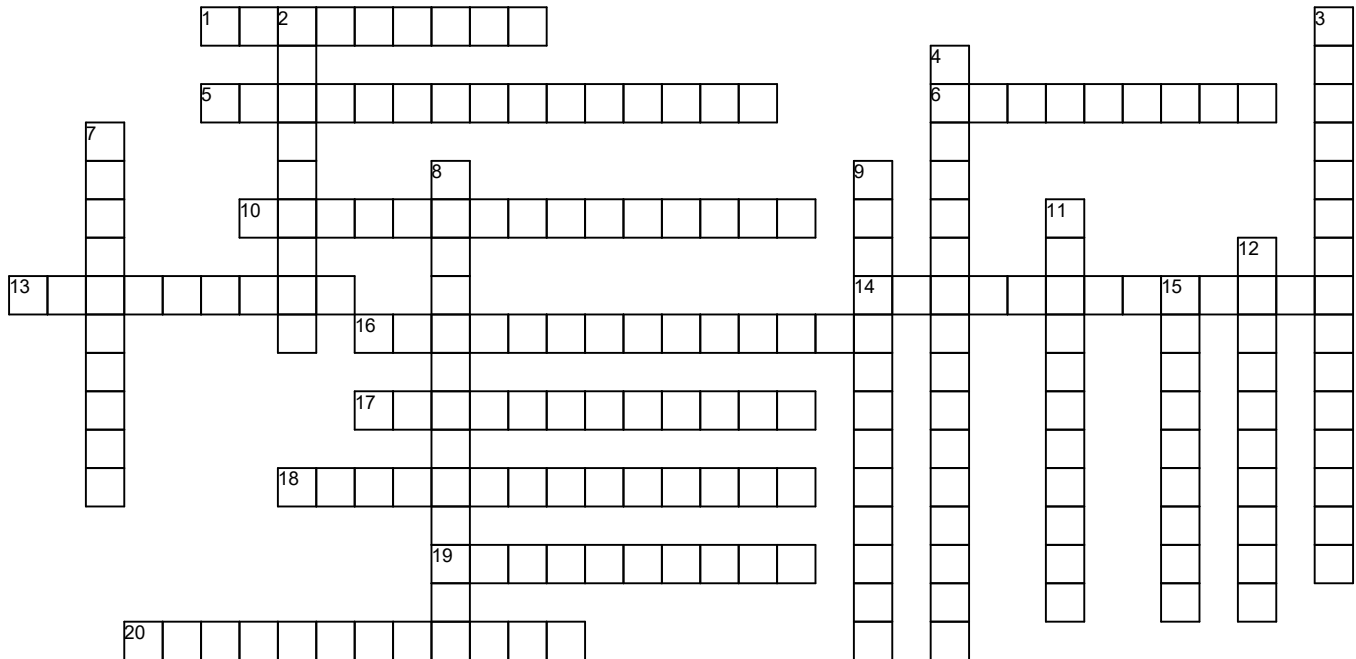


Famous Women Crossword Puzzle
