
Famous Women Politicians Crossword Puzzle

- Senator from New York known for her advocacy of women's rights, LGBTQ rights, and combating sexual assault in the military.
- 10. Former First Lady and human rights activist, known for her advocacy of civil rights, women's rights, and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
- 12. Congresswoman representing New York's 14th congressional district, known for her progressive policies and activism.
- 14. Congresswoman representing California's 43rd congressional district, known for her advocacy of civil rights and affordable housing.
- 15. Current Vice President of the United States, the first woman, first African American, and first Asian American to hold the office.
- 16. First woman elected to the United States Congress, representing Montana in 1917 and again in 1941.
- 17. Former Governor of Alaska and Vice Presidential candidate in the 2008 election.
- Former First Lady, Senator, and Secretary of State, she was the first woman to be nominated for President by a major party in the United States.
- 19. Former First Lady known for her advocacy of education, nutrition, and military families.
- 20. Senator from Massachusetts and former presidential candidate known for her advocacy of consumer protection and progressive policies.

- 2. Senator from Maine known for her moderate Republican stance and bipartisan approach to legislation.
- 3. Former Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court, known for her advocacy of gender equality and women's rights.
- 4. First African American woman elected to the Texas Senate and the first Southern African-American woman elected to the United States House of Representatives.
- 5. First female vice presidential candidate on a major party ticket, running alongside Walter Mondale in 1984.
- 6. Former Secretary of State, the first woman to hold the position in the United States.
- 7. Lawyer, congresswoman, and leader of the women's movement, known for her work on gender equality and social justice.
- 8. Current Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the first woman to hold the position.
- 9. Senator from Illinois and former Army National Guard helicopter pilot,
- 11. First African American woman elected to Congress and the first African American candidate for a major party's nomination for President of the United States.
- 13. Former Secretary of State and National Security Advisor, the first African American woman to hold both positions.
