1. Kamala Harris Current Vice President of the United States, the first woman, first African American, and first Asian American to hold the office.
2. Hillary Clinton Former First Lady, Senator, and Secretary of State, she was the first woman to be nominated for President by a major party in the United States.
3. Nancy Pelosi Current Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the first woman to hold the position.
4. Ruth Bader Ginsburg Former Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court, known for her advocacy of gender equality and women's rights.
5. Elizabeth Warren Senator from Massachusetts and former presidential candidate known for her advocacy of consumer protection and progressive policies.
6. Condoleezza Rice Former Secretary of State and National Security Advisor, the first African American woman to hold both positions.
7. Shirley Chisholm First African American woman elected to Congress and the first African American candidate for a major party's nomination for President of the United States.
8. Geraldine Ferraro First female vice presidential candidate on a major party ticket, running alongside Walter Mondale in 1984.
9. Madeleine Albright Former Secretary of State, the first woman to hold the position in the United States.
10. Michelle Obama Former First Lady known for her advocacy of education, nutrition, and military families.
11. Barbara Jordan First African American woman elected to the Texas Senate and the first Southern African-American woman elected to the United States House of Representatives.
12. Sarah Palin Former Governor of Alaska and Vice Presidential candidate in the 2008 election.
13. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez Congresswoman representing New York's 14th congressional district, known for her progressive policies and activism.
14. Maxine Waters Congresswoman representing California's 43rd congressional district, known for her advocacy of civil rights and affordable housing.
15. Susan Collins Senator from Maine known for her moderate Republican stance and bipartisan approach to legislation.
16. Kirsten Gillibrand Senator from New York known for her advocacy of women's rights, LGBTQ rights, and combating sexual assault in the military.
17. Eleanor Roosevelt Former First Lady and human rights activist, known for her advocacy of civil rights, women's rights, and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
18. Bella Abzug Lawyer, congresswoman, and leader of the women's movement, known for her work on gender equality and social justice.
19. Jeannette Rankin First woman elected to the United States Congress, representing Montana in 1917 and again in 1941.
20. Tammy Duckworth Senator from Illinois and former Army National Guard helicopter pilot,
