1.	Franklin Pierce	14th President of the United States, serving from 1853 to 1857.
2.	New Hampshire	The state where Franklin Pierce was born in 1804.
3.	Jane Pierce	Wife of Franklin Pierce; she was often referred to as the "Shadow of the White House."
4.	Bowdoin College	Institution where Pierce attended before studying law.
5.	Mexican-American War	Conflict in which Franklin Pierce served as a brigadier general.
6.	Gadsden Purchase	Acquisition of land from Mexico during Pierce's presidency, facilitating the southern transcontinental railroad.
7.	Kansas-Nebraska Act	Controversial legislation that repealed the Missouri Compromise and heightened tensions over slavery.
8.	Democratic Party	Political party to which Franklin Pierce belonged.
9.	Concord	Capital city of New Hampshire, where Pierce practiced law and entered politics.
10.	Compromise of 1850	Series of laws aimed at addressing the issue of slavery in the territories acquired after the Mexican-American War.
11.	Nathaniel Hawthorne	Notable American author and friend of Franklin Pierce.
12.	Fugitive Slave Act	Legislation passed as part of the Compromise of 1850, which required citizens to assist in the capture of runaway slaves.
13.	Oregon Territory	Northwestern region of the United States, which saw territorial disputes settled during Pierce's presidency.
14.	Democratic National Convention	Event where Pierce was nominated as the presidential candidate in 1852.
15.	New Hampshire Legislature	Franklin Pierce's first political office, which he held at the age of 24.
16.	Battle of Contreras	Major engagement during the Mexican-American War in which Pierce distinguished himself.
17.	Amherst	Town in New Hampshire where Pierce spent his later years.
18.	Jefferson Davis	Close friend and Secretary of War under Pierce, later becoming the President of the Confederate States of America.
