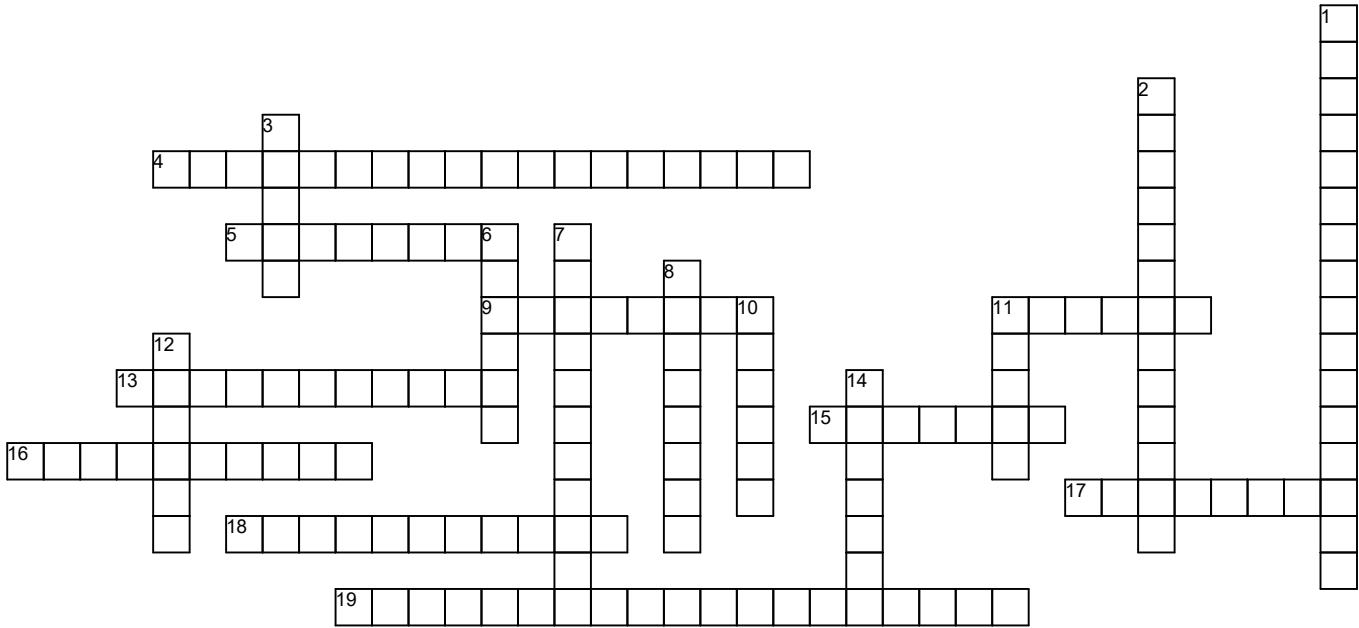


# Business Math Terms Crossword Puzzle 2
