

President Andrew Johnson Study Sheet

1. Reconstruction Period following the Civil War characterized by efforts to rebuild the South and integrate freed slaves into society.
2. Impeachment Political process initiated against Andrew Johnson in 1868, though he narrowly avoided removal from office.
3. Tennessee State where Andrew Johnson served as governor before becoming president.
4. Lincoln Predecessor of Andrew Johnson, whose assassination elevated Johnson to the presidency.
5. Tailor Profession Andrew Johnson held before entering politics.
6. Republican Political party that clashed with Andrew Johnson over Reconstruction policies.
7. Veto Power Andrew Johnson frequently exercised, leading to clashes with Congress.
8. Union Side Andrew Johnson supported during the Civil War, despite being from a Confederate state.
9. 17th Amendment Outlines the process for presidential succession, clarified after Andrew Johnson's term.
10. Homestead Act Law signed by Andrew Johnson, which provided settlers with 160 acres of public land.
11. Racism Attitude Andrew Johnson displayed through his Reconstruction policies, much to the dismay of abolitionists.
12. War Democrat Label often applied to Andrew Johnson due to his support for the Union during the Civil War.
13. Raleigh City where Andrew Johnson was born in 1808.
14. Constitution Document Andrew Johnson vowed to uphold despite disagreements with Congress.
15. South Region heavily affected by Andrew Johnson's Reconstruction policies.
16. Slavery Institution abolished during Andrew Johnson's presidency with the ratification of the 13th Amendment.
17. Seward Secretary of State who served under Andrew Johnson and negotiated the purchase of Alaska from Russia.
18. Patronage Practice of rewarding political supporters with government jobs, which Andrew Johnson used extensively.
