

President Grant Study Sheet

1. Grant's Birthplace Point Pleasant, Ohio.
2. Union General Ulysses S. Grant led the Union Army during the American Civil War.
3. Appomattox Courthouse Location where Robert E. Lee surrendered to Grant, effectively ending the Civil War.
4. Reconstruction Grant's presidency saw efforts to rebuild the South after the Civil War.
5. Battle of Shiloh Grant's first major victory in the Civil War, though with heavy casualties.
6. 18th President Grant served two terms from 1869 to 1877.
7. Transcontinental Railroad Grant signed legislation authorizing its construction. The first one to span the continent.
8. Ulysses Simpson Grant Full name of the 18th president.
9. Fort Donelson Key Confederate stronghold captured by Grant in 1862.
10. Whiskey Ring Scandal Controversy during Grant's administration involving bribery and tax evasion.
11. Julia Dent Grant Grant's wife and First Lady of the United States during his presidency.
12. Yellowstone Established as the first national park during Grant's presidency.
13. Mexican-American War Grant served as a junior officer in this conflict prior to the Civil War.
14. Civil Rights Act of 1875 Legislation aimed at protecting the rights of African Americans passed during Grant's presidency.
15. Battle of Vicksburg Grant's successful siege of this Confederate stronghold was a turning point in the Civil War.
16. Freedmen's Bureau Agency established to aid former slaves during Reconstruction, supported by Grant.
17. Republican Party Grant was a member of this political party and its nominee for president.
18. Battle of Chattanooga Union victory led by Grant, securing control of Tennessee.
19. Grant's Tomb Final resting place of Grant and his wife, located in New York City's Riverside Park.
