13.	si se puede	Spanish phrase meaning "Yes, you can," associated with Chavez.
14.	March to Sacramento	300-mile march Chavez led in 1966 to bring attention to farm workers' plight.
15.	Presidential Medal of Freedom	Awarded to Chavez posthumously in 1994.
16.	huelga	Spanish word for "strike," commonly used in Chavez's campaigns.
17.	Chavez Day	March 31 is recognized as this day to honor his legacy.
18.	boycott	Method used to protest unfair labor practices, often led by Chavez.
19.	community service organization	First organization where Chavez worked as an organizer.
20.	farm workers	Main group Chavez advocated for throughout his life.
21.	Aztec Eagle	Symbol of the United Farm Workers union.
