14.	ziggurat	A terraced pyramid-like structure built in ancient Mesopotamia.

16.	Sphinx	A mythical creature with a lion's body and a human head, located near the pyramids of Giza.
17.	burial chamber	The room inside a pyramid where a body is laid to rest.
18.	Aztecs	A Mesoamerican civilization that built pyramids in what is now Mexico.
19.	Nubian Pyramids	Smaller pyramids built by the Kingdom of Kush in what is now Sudan.
20.	Tikal	A major Mayan city that features many pyramid-like temples.
21.	alignment	The precise orientation of pyramids with the cardinal directions or celestial bodies.
22.	Valley of the Kings	An area in Egypt where many pharaohs were buried in tombs rather than pyramids.
23.	hieroglyphs	The writing system used in ancient Egypt, often inscribed inside pyramids.
24.	excavation	The process of digging up remains of ancient structures like pyramids.
