8.	Old Man	The victim of the narrator's obsession.
9.	floorboards	Where the narrator hides the body under after the murder.
10.	scream	A loud noise heard by a neighbor, prompting a visit from the police.
11.	midnight	The time when the narrator creeps into the old man's room.
12.	Evil Eye	The narrator's name for the old man's eye.
13.	bedroom	The setting of the murder in the story.
14.	Narrator	The character who tells the story.
15.	fear	The emotion that grips the old man when he senses someone in his room.
16.	shadows	These add to the eerie atmosphere of the story.
17.	time	The narrator constantly mentions this concept, emphasizing its slow passage.
18.	sanity	The narrator attempts to prove that he possesses this.
19.	confession	What the narrator ultimately makes to the police at the end.
20.	obsession	The narrator's intense fixation on the old man's eye is an example of this.
21.	knife	The weapon the narrator uses to kill the old man.
22.	isolation	The feeling of being cut off from others, experienced by both the narrator and the old man.
23.	horror	A common theme in Poe's works, including this story.
24.	truth	Despite the narrator's efforts, this comes out in the end.
